We observe all creel limits and recommend catch and release policies of the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife. Due to unacceptable mortality release rates for striped bass, all striped bass trips on Lake Cumberland are your limit (2 fish, 24" minimum length, per angler) or 6 hours, whichever occurs first.
